THE BLUE RIDGE CITY COUNCIL MET IN SPECIAL SESSION AT 7:00 P.M. ON TUESDAY, MAY 8, 2018 AT THE BLUE RIDGE COMMUNITY CENTER, LOCATED AT 200 W. TILTON, BLUE RIDGE, TEXAS 75424 AT 7:00 P.M. WITH THE FOLLOWING ITEMS ON THE AGENDA FOR CONSIDERATION AND/OR ACTION.

- 1. Mayor Williams called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.
- Roll was called with the following members present: Mayor Rhonda Williams, Allen Cunnyngham, Christina Porath, Amber Wood and Gerald Young. Kevin Bell was not present.
- 3. Proclamation for Men's Health Month June

Mayor Williams proclaimed the month of June as Men's Health Month and declared the week of June 11 - 17, 2018 as Men's Health Week in the City of Blue Ridge.

4. Consent Agenda: a) Discuss, approve or disapprove the minutes from Regular Session meeting held April 3, 2018 and Special Session meeting held on April 17, 2018; b) Public Works Update; c) City Financial Report; d) Fire Department Report; e) Animal Control Report; and f) Collin County Calls for Service

Christina Porath motioned to approve the Consent Agenda as presented with Amber Wood seconding the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

5. <u>Consider, discuss and act upon Ordinance # 2018-0508-001 canvassing returns and declaring the results of the May 5, 2018 City of Blue Ridge General Election</u>

(Examinar, discutir y actuar en la Ordinance # 2018-0508-001 Sondeos devoluciones y declarar los resultados del 5 de mayo, 2018 Ciudad de Blue Ridge Elecciones Generales)

Mayor Williams read the votes as prepared by Collin County Elections. Christina Porath motioned to approve the ordinance canvassing the election as presented with Amber Wood seconding the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

6. <u>Consider, discuss and act upon a Concept Plan for apartments located at 101 Tilton Street</u> (Old Grocery Store)

Eric Freeman, potential new owner of the property, and Keith Merz, Project Manager, came before the Council with a Concept Plan of 4 apartments located in the Old Grocery Store. These apartments will be one bedroom with brick fascade. All plumbing will be on shared walls and the attempt to keep the old tin ceiling tiles. Christina Porath questioned the parking which was answered with 4 slots in front of the building and access to parking on the square. Each apartment will be approximately 650 square feet being 20 foot wide and approximately 30 foot deep. The exposed brick will remain for aesthetics. Amber Wood stated she liked keeping the historical elements.

Council also questioned the entrances of each apartment. Mr. Merz stated each apartment will have one entry/exit to each apartment. The two apartments in the rear will have entry/exit in the rear. Christina Porath expressed concern for residents parking on the square and trekking around the building to enter their apartment.

Amber Wood motioned to approve the Concept Plan as presented. The motion died for lack of a second. No further discussion or action was taken.

7. Consider, discuss and act upon paying off the loan to American National Bank of Texas for the City Hall building and property located at 200 S Main Street in the amount of \$22,050.69

By paying off the loan, the City would save \$4,761.30 and end the ongoing interest accrual of \$2.85 per day. Amber Wood motioned to pay the loan with an amount not to exceed \$23,000.00 to allow for interest during the payoff transaction with Gerald Young seconding the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

8. Consider, discuss and act upon Ordinance # 2018-0508-002 regarding junked vehicles, weeds and rubbish

The Ordinance presented will be compliant with current State Law and repeal all old ordinances which will not provide proper enforcement. Amber Wood motioned to approve the Ordinance as presented with Christina Porath seconding the motion. Motion carried 3 to 1 with Allen Cunnyngham in opposition.

9. Consider, discuss and act upon a contract with Sanifation Solutions for solid waste collection

Some of the major changes included in the contract was negotiated by the City Secretary for 3 house demolitions and removing City Wide Cleanup dumpsters and the pricing for residential trash is cheaper than the current provider even with a 15% Franchise Fee.

Christina Porath motioned to approve the contract as presented with Amber Wood seconding the motion. Motion carried unanimously.

10. Enter into Executive Session pursuant to Section 551.074 of the Texas Government Code to discuss Personnel Matters - deliberate the appointment, appointment, evaluation, reassignment, duties, discipline, or dismissal of a public officer or employee: Assistant City Secretary

Council entered into Executive Session at 7:14pm.

Council exited Executive Session and entered into the Open Meeting. No action was taken on items discussed in Executive Session.



It was a pleasure visiting with you earlier today. As we discussed, please find two 10 year Certificate of Obligation scenarios assuming the funding of \$300,000 and \$350,000. If you want to look at a shorter amortization, please let me know, and I can provide that.

Additionally, if the City were to pursue this financing, I would recommend that we pursue a 'private placement.' Compared to 'open market' transactions, 'private placements' have lower issuance costs since there are no rating requirements and you do not have to produce a preliminary official statement. This is a conversation we can have at a later date.

Certificates of Obligation can be issued for any <u>public</u> purpose. Unlike General Obligation Bonds, they do not require a public referendum. However, State Law does require that a 'Notice of Intent' to issue Certificates of Obligation be published in the City's Newspaper of Record on the <u>same day</u> for <u>two consecutive</u> weeks with the first publication being at least <u>31 days before</u> the sale date [Council approval date]. This allows adequate time to inform the public of the potential debt sale as CO's are subject to petition. A petition by at least 5% of the registered voters can force the City to hold a referendum for the project. Tax Notes are another debt instrument that do not require a vote (and are not subject to a petition), however, they are limited to a 7 year term.

Assuming that you would want to issue the CO's before the end of this fiscal year (17/18) so that you can levy a tax and include the CO's in your upcoming budget, the timetable would look something like this (assuming an August 7th authorization):

July 3rd – Council approves Notice of Intent to Issue CO's (this spells out what the debt will be used for and the maximum amount to be issued)

July 7^{th} – <u>Last date</u> to publish the first NOI in the newspaper

July 14th - Second publication of the NOI in the newspaper

August 7th - Council considers adoption of ordinance authorizing the CO's

September 6^{th} – delivery of funds to the City (takes about 30 days as the Texas AG must approve the transaction) February 15, 2019 – first payment due on the CO's

ORDINANCE# 2018-0605-002

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLUE RIDGE, TEXAS, AMENDING THE BUDGET FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 2017-2018 IN ACCORDANCE WITH EXISTING STATUTORY REQUIREMENTS APPROPRIATING THE VARIOUS AMOUNTS HEREIN; REPEALING ALL PRIOR ORDINANCES AND ACTIONS IN CONFLICT HEREWITH; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, the City of Blue Ridge, Texas is a Type A General-Law Municipality located in Collin County, created in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 6 of the Texas Local Government Code, and operating pursuant to the enabling legislation of the State of Texas;

WHEREAS, the Mayor of the City of Blue Ridge has reviewed the budget and which budget was adopted by the City Council for the Fiscal Year 2017-2018; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor has determined the effects of the budget amendment will be in the best interest used for a transfer from the General Fund Balance to the Revenue Fund to accommodate an unfunded expense for the cost of repairs to the Wastewater Treatment Plant, as shown by Exhibit "A"; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor of the City of Blue Ridge believes the budget requires certain amendments and has submitted to the City Council proposed amendment(s) to the budget of the revenues and expenditures of conducting the affairs of said City as submitted by the Mayor.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLUE RIDGE, TEXAS;

SECTION 1. BUDGET AMENDMENT ADOPTION

From and after the effective date of this Ordinance, the amendments to the budget of the revenues and expenditures for the Fiscal Year 2017-2018 that are attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein by reference are hereby adopted and the budget for Fiscal Year 2017-2018 is hereby accordingly so amended and the amended budget for Fiscal Year 2017-2018 adopted.

SECTION 2. SEVERABILITY

It is hereby declared to be the intention of the City Council that the words, phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs and sections of this Ordinance are severable, and if any word, phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section of this Ordinance shall be declared unconstitutional by the valid judgment or decree of any court of competent jurisdiction, such unconstitutionality shall not affect any of the remaining words, phrases, clauses, sentences, paragraphs and sections of this Ordinance, since the same would have been enacted by the City Council without the incorporation of this Ordinance of any such unconstitutional word, phrase, clause, sentence, paragraph or section.

SECTION 3: REPEALER CLAUSE

Any provision of any prior ordinance of the City, whether codified or uncodified, which is in conflict with any provision of this Ordinance, is hereby repealed to the extent of the conflict, but all other provisions of the ordinances of the City, whether codified or uncodified, which are not in conflict with the provisions of this Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.

SECTION 4: ENGROSSMENT AND ENROLLMENT

The City Secretary of the City of Blue Ridge is hereby directed to engross and enroll this Ordinance by copying the exact Caption and the Effective Date clause in the minutes of the City Council of the City of Blue Ridge and by filing this Ordinance in the Ordinance records of the City.

SECTION 5: SAVINGS

All rights and remedies of the City of Blue Ridge are expressly saved as to any and all violations of the provisions of any Ordinances which have accrued at the time of the effective date of this Ordinance; and, as to such accrued violations and all pending litigation, both civil and criminal, whether pending in court or not, under such Ordinances, same shall not be affected by this Ordinance but may be prosecuted until final disposition by the courts.

SECTION 6. EFFECTIVE DATE

This Ordinance shall take effect immediately from and after its passage.



This email is for TNMP Cities / Gulf Coast Coalition of Cities members.

Earlier today, Texas-New Mexico Power ("TNMP") Electric Company filed a rate case application with cities retaining original jurisdiction or legal authority over its rates. Simultaneously, they filed the rate request at the Public Utility Commission. In the application TNMP is seeking to increase rates on a system-wide basis by \$33.3 million annually. Overall, this is a 16.3% increase to retail rates. This is TNMP's first comprehensive base rate case in eight years. If approved, an average residential customer will see a monthly increase of \$12.21 to their electric bill. As a class, residential rates will increase 23.4% if approved.

Cities have jurisdiction over this matter. Attached you will find documents that your city will need in order to suspend the effective date of the rate increase and allow cities time to review the filing. We will be filing a motion to intervene at the PUC on behalf of the group and have hired two consultants to review the application. Please place this item on your next council meeting. Cities with original jurisdiction will need to adopt the resolution no later than July 5. I have also attached a resolution that cities *without* original jurisdiction may use to participate in the case with the other cities. This applies to the cities of Blue Ridge, Celeste, Emory and Hamilton. Once your city has adopted the resolution, please provide us with a copy. ACTION REQUIRED BY JULY 5, 2018

On May 30, 2018, Texas-New Mexico Power Company (TNMP) filed a Statement of Intent to Increase Rates with all cities in its service area that retain original jurisdiction. The Company is seeking a \$33.3 million rate increase. If approved, the \$33.3 million increase would raise rates for the average residential customers by \$12.21 per month.

The rate increase requested by TNMP will become effective on July 5, 2018, unless the city takes action to suspend the effective date. The statute permits cities to extend the effective date by up to 90 days in order to study the filing. The city must take action to suspend the effective date by July 5, 2018. If your city does not have a regular council meeting scheduled before July 5 or is otherwise unable to take action on the suspension resolution by July 5, please contact me as soon as possible.

Attached to this memo is a model suspension resolution and staff report. It is possible that TNMP local managers may be providing cities with a model denial resolution and recommending that the city immediately deny the rate request. We do not recommend that you deny the request at this time. Suspending the effective date allows cities more time to review the application and decide on the final action, including settlement or denial of TNMP's requested rate increase.

MODEL STAFF REPORT

ACTION MUST BE TAKEN TO SUSPEND THE EFFECTIVE DATE ON OR BEFORE JULY 5, 2018

PURPOSE

Texas-New Mexico Power Company (TNMP or the Company) filed an application on May 30, 2018 with cities retaining original jurisdiction seeking to increase system-wide transmission and distribution rates by \$33.3 million. The Company asks the City to approve a 23.4% increase in residential rates and a 11.8% increase in street lighting rates. Monthly rates would increase by approximately \$12.21 for an average residential customer.

The resolution suspends the July 5, 2018 effective date of the Company's rate increase for the maximum period permitted by law to allow the City, working in conjunction with other cities served by TNMP, to evaluate the filing, determine whether the filing complies with law, and if lawful, to determine what further strategy, including settlement, to pursue.

The law provides that a rate request made by an electric utility cannot become effective until at least 35 days following the filing of the application to change rates. The law permits the City to suspend the rate change for 90 days after the date the rate change would otherwise be effective. If the City fails to take some action regarding the filing before the effective date, TNMP's rate request is deemed approved.

DISCUSSION

The City of ______ is a member of a coalition of cities known alternatively as the Cities Served by TNMP and the Gulf Coast Coalition of Cities (TNMP Cities). The Coalition has been in existence since the early 1990s. TNMP Cities have been the primary public interest advocate before the Public Utility Commission, the Courts, and the Legislature on electric utility regulation matters for over 20 years.

Explanation of "Be It Resolved" Paragraphs:

Section 1. The city is authorized to suspend the rate change for 90 days after the date that the rate change would otherwise be effective for any legitimate purpose. Time to study and investigate the application is always a legitimate purpose. Please note that the resolution refers to the suspension period as "the maximum period allowed by law" rather than ending by a specific date. This is because the Company controls the effective date and can extend the deadline for final city action to increase the time that the City retains jurisdiction if necessary to reach settlement on the case. If the suspension period is not otherwise extended by the Company, the City must take final action on TNMP's request to raise rates by October 3, 2018.

Section 2. This provision authorizes the City to participate in a coalition of cities served by TNMP in order to more efficiently represent the interests of the City and their citizens.

- Section 3. This provision authorizes the hiring of Lloyd Gosselink and consultants to represent the City in this matter. It also provides authority for the attorneys and consultants to act on behalf of the City at the local level in settlement discussions, in preparation of a rate ordinance, on appeal of the rate ordinance to the PUC, and on appeal to the Courts. Negotiating clout and efficiency are enhanced by the City cooperation in a common review and common purpose. Additionally, rate case expenses are minimized when cities hire one set of attorneys and experts who work under the guidance and control of the cities.
- Section 4. The Company will reimburse the cities for their reasonable rate case expenses. Legal counsel and consultants approved by the TNMP Cities will submit monthly invoices that will be forwarded to TNMP for reimbursement. No individual city incurs liability for payment of rate case expenses by adopting a suspension resolution.
- Section 5. This section merely recites that the resolution was passed at a meeting that was open to the public and that the consideration of the Resolution was properly noticed.
- Section 6. This section provides that both TNMP's counsel and counsel for the cities will be notified of the City's action by sending a copy of the approved and signed resolution to certain designated individuals.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLUE RIDGE, TEXAS AMENDING BLUE RIDGE'S CODE OF ORDINANCES "MASTER FEE SCHEDULE," TO INCLUDE A RETAINER FEE; PROVIDING FOR A REPEALER CLAUSE; PROVIDING FOR A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND SETTING AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF BLUE RIDGE, TEXAS:

SECTION 1: That with a Subdivision Application, the City of Blue Ridge is hereby amended to read as follows:

SECTION 2:

Retainer Fee	All plats will require the applicant to pay a \$1,000 Retainer Fee to pay for engineering, attorney fees and other subcontracted costs, if necessary, as pass through fees. In the event costs exceed the initial \$1,000 Retainer Fee, the applicant will be required to pay another \$1,000 Retainer Fee until all costs have been paid. Any fees remaining from the Retainer Fee will be refunded to the applicant after completion of the Building Permit process.
Preliminary Plat Application	\$300
Final Plat Applications	\$300

SECTION 3. SEVERABILITY CLAUSE

That should any sentence, paragraph, subdivision, clause, phrase or section of this ordinance be adjudged or held to be unconstitutional, illegal or invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of this ordinance as a whole, or any part or provision thereof other than the part so decided to be invalid, illegal or unconstitutional.

SECTION 4. REPEALER CLAUSE

That all ordinances of the City of Blue Ridge, Texas, in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance be, and the same are hereby repealed.

SECTION 5. This Ordinance shall take effect after approval and adoption by the City Council and with publication of the caption, as the law in such cases provides.
